devoted himself largely to composing for the piano (he's a truly formidable performer on it), and the majority of his pieces are shorter. There must be something in the Boston water that encourages prolificity, because like his fellow composer Carson Cooman, his output is astonishing. The most recent work on this collection is Op.541, no.94! But what is even more remarkable is how consistently strong and penetrating his music is. McDonald has an ability to focus in on an idea/motive/gesture and work it for all it's worth. While not traditionally tonal, the music is always clearly focused by an idea, motive, or gesture. McDonald's music is astringent and economical. It says what it needs to and that's that. I've come to think of him as "the American Kurtág", as he shares with that elder a taste to brevity, intensity, clarity. His Mort and Temp bookend the first disc; the latter with its piquant progressions, seems a fitting benediction upon the whole enterprise)
